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

Program Highlights

- Theme, followed a DaVinci Code "Secret Society" motif, offering creative interpretations and opportunities to weave into various activities and teambuilding elements.
- The destination setting in rural France, at an12th Century Abbey converted into a 5-star accommodation, provided captivating scenery and locations that naturally gave an incredible background to the programming.

- Around L'Abbaye in 80 Minutes, one of the major teambuilding activities, paid homage to the internationally acclaimed novel, Around the World in Eighty Days. In Moniker's take on this adventure, teams were challenged to create their own methods of travel: land, air, and water, to best the other teams.
- Moniker's bespoke Scavenger Hunt at the Louvre offered a dynamic and engaging way to explore the rich cultural heritage of France. Here, participants embarked on a journey through one of the world's most iconic museums, interacting with France's artistic masterpieces. Participants were tasked with solving clues, tracking down and interacting with costumed actors to uncover answers.
- CSR Activity: The entire group gathered on grounds of the hotel in support of a local children's hospital, split into teams and raced against the clock to build 20 bicycles to be donated to the hospital. Followed by the world's slowest bike race. Hospital reps were present to relay stories of the positive impact this collaborative initiative would have on the children.
- The LePlex Boutique: A custom-made souvenir shop stocked full of Plex-branded French items. Ranging from engraved cheese boards and aprons to stuffed animal French poodles and fleur-de-lis laptop stickers.
 Best of all, limited edition PlexVuitton button-up shirts and bucket hats, designed as a playful nod to France's famed designer.

SITE Canada Leads The Way In Sustainability at SITE Global Conference in Mexico



In an industry where just about everyone wants to know what "sustainability" can look like in incentive travel – Canada just showed the way.

30 of SITE Canada's members were on hand during the 2025 SITE Global Conference in Tulum, Mexico to cheer the association's "Excellence in Sustainable Event" win at the SITE Chapter Excellence Awards.

"This is such important recognition," said SITE Canada Sustainability Ambassador Liz Akey. "We wanted to build an event that really focused on meeting as many UN Sustainability Goals as possible."

The Event – A May Mixer like no other.

That event was SITE Canada's May Mixer, held in Ontario's Niagara region. In total, it met more than a third of the UN's goals with a powerful program that included:

- Direct support by the venues at the 124 Queen Hotel and Treadwells Restaurant, plus LEED-Certified winery Stratus Vineyards
- A meat-free plant- and fish-based menu
- No paper/no promotional items (QR code-based)
- A best practices-based keynote by a local college Sustainability Director Taryn Wilkinson
- Collaboration with local women's shelter Gillian's Place, which included donations and handwritten notes for women in residence

Program measurement found a number of key milestones, recognized by SITE Global – including a full 68% reduction in carbon emissions, plus post event survey insights that featured recued food miles, and the planting trees to offset environmental impact.

"This is a moment where we've made our entire organization, industry, and country proud," added Liz.
